## WHY DO WE WEAR HELMETS – FOR SAFETY "OF COURSE"

nyone with a two-wheeler license would know "why a person needs to wear a helmet" whilst riding a two-wheeler vehicle as it's one of the most commonly asked questions in the written examinations while applying for a driving license. The answer's unanimous – for safety, of course.

It was earlier last January when I remember my friend visiting me with his new scooter asking me to accompany him while commuting to New Road. As he was a new inductee in the "list of friends owing a two-wheeler", I asked him to sit back and enjoy the ride (as I didn't trust him with his novice riding experience). I then asked him a "very complex" question - "Why do we wear helmets?". He simply replied, "For safety, of course". I refuted and told him that we wear the helmet for traffic police, isn't it? He refused to agree, but when I made him realize that he had not been wearing a helmet during our commute, he reluctantly agreed he was not wearing a helmet because the law permits him to.

It's kind of a cultural thing in the nation to think morally but never to put it into practice. For instance, a similar safety protocol can be observed in the case of four-wheelers as well; only the driver needs to put in a seat belt, and upon asked the application of the belt, everyone responds unanimously – for safety. While there isn't any research suggesting that the probability of injuries or death occurs only to riders or drivers, passengers themselves are reluctant to



put on any safety measures only because they are not convicted by the law. Other provoking instances of Nepali law occur in the case of drink and driving, often coined as "Ma.Pa.Se". The zero-tolerance policy of the traffic police has indeed reduced road accidents led by drinking and driving; however, people are often provoked to drink way more than they should as the punishment for a pint of beer is equivalent to the person that is close to the passing out. Moreover, people follow rules and regulations not for their safety but for the sake of avoiding fines. It isn't uncommon to see people trying to take U-turns or entering one-ways in the absence of a traffic police.

According to research conducted by the Nepal Demographic and Health Survey (2022), motorcycles contribute to the highest frequency of road accidents and crashes in Nepal. Moreover, twothirds of the road accident deaths involve motorcycles (The Kathmandu Post, 2023). On top of that, 5% suffer brain damage, which could have been minimized should the use of helmets be mandatory for both the rider and pillion. The prevalent ludicrous traffic rule that is predominant today was not always practiced in Nepal. According to Nepal's Motor Vehicle and Transport Management Act 1993, both the rider and the pillion are required to wear helmets.



However, since the early 2000s, the rule has not been in practice. Later in 2019,

traffic officials did try reinforcing the act but had to face the allegations of being

"hand-in-glove with the helmet traders" (Nepal Minute, 2023). The widespread criticism over social media allegedly put a stop to the mission as the traffic officials did not want to get their hands dirty. What is ironic is that all the cases that have been popular over social media have not been treated with the same consciousness. There are lots of examples including the case of Ncell not paying the tax to the government, the gold smuggling cases that have at least been reported twice, or the overwhelming post over social media against MCC. Despite these cases being famous over social media, they weren't treated like the case of traffic officials and helmet traders. So, this raises the question "Was it the commission that has been halting the safety of motorcyclists?" or is it simply that the government has listened to its people.
